





Essential Business Clarification

As of yesterday, Governor Wolf and his Administration urge non-essential businesses across the state to close for at least 14 days to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. We have received multiple questions seeking clarification surrounding the classification of businesses within our county. Please reference the chart below. It is worth noting that NON-ESSENTIAL businesses are largely public-facing industries.

Businesses that offer carry-out, delivery, and drive-through food and beverage service may continue to do so, but eating and drinking inside restaurants and bars is temporarily prohibited.
